n my first days as CEO, I joined our young people for dinner made by our culinary students, sitting with a young man who shared his struggles with his sexual orientation and unstable housing.

I was moved. I know now that his trust in me came from the sense of community we create.

Months later, I attended a workshop for immigrants concerned about their futures in the wake of the national election. The tension was palpable, but our staff's expertise was a balm to their anxieties.

All of our young people are seeking a chance at a better, more stable future.

Some come to us in crisis, while others are seeking opportunity. No matter their need, we support them as they prepare for what's ahead.

That is our strength.

We tackle the obstacles facing New York's young people, supporting 10,000 each year. We offer one-of-a-kind opportunities: job placement, health care, crisis intervention, college preparation and high school equivalencies, legal representation, and more.

This year, we:

- expanded our career programs to include high-demand trade paths, including culinary and masonry
- increased specialized staffing to aid those who have been sexually exploited
- won a major national grant from the Annie E. Casey Foundation to provide tailored support for youth in the juvenile justice and/ or foster care systems
- won a \$6.49 million city-wide grant as a model youth hub.

This is a fraction of our impressive accomplishments this year.

his past year, we accomplished some of our most exciting and trailblazing work through our partnerships.

As a new national grantee of the Annie E. Casey Foundation, we are working to improve post-secondary outcomes for foster care, justice-involved, and homeless youth in New York City through deep collaborations with city agencies, universities, and other nonprofits. We help these young people advance through programs that support their successful transition to college, as well as through customized training programs for emergency medical technician (EMT) and IT jobs.

In other new partnerships, young people are being trained and

placed in jobs in masonry, historical preservation, and technical theater. With our tailored support, young people are taking huge strides toward self-sustaining careers.

While we're starting small with these programs so we can break down the toughest barriers and figure out what works best, our long-standing programs are achieving remarkable scale. Ten years ago, we started a training, internship, and jobs program with Gap Inc., beginning with a couple dozen internships. It now places 334 interns a year, with 70% offered permanent jobs. We're working collaboratively to expand our numbers to 542 young people a year by 2023 to help Gap Inc. reach their ambitious goal of 5% of all national entry-level hires coming from this program.

We are confident that with the right resources — including support from you — there are no limits to what young people can achieve. Intervening the right way now shapes a positive path for their futures!

Renee left the Dominican Republic as a teen three years ago. Because of her age, she didn't know what being undocumented would mean for her future.

"You can't work or go to college. Nothing," Renee says. It was the biggest challenge she's faced. It held her back from her dreams.

She started coming to The Door to spend time with a friend. But when she realized we offered free legal services, she jumped at the chance for help. With our support, she was able to get her green card.

With that road block out of her path, she dove into some of our other programs. She completed our Culinary Training program, and she can still often be found in our kitchen, helping the chef make dinner. "I enjoy it because what you learn in that kitchen — or just at The Door period — you can take home."

She also joined our College Paths program and has just finished her first year at Brooklyn Manhattan Community College, where she's studying human services.

Though she's already done so much, she's ready for more: she hopes one day to work with undocumented youth. "It is so important to give back. Especially now. Things are really scary, even for me sometimes. I want to be a voice for the voiceless."

"When you're undocumented, you're isolated. You feel useless, hopeless."

Amazia has bounced around a lot and has had a sometimes-challenging relationship with his family. But he's always known what he wanted to do with his future: to be an engineer, a creator.

Paying for school was a daunting obstacle for him, so he came to The Door to find work. Not only did our staff help him find his first job, we also helped him enroll in college so he could start studying electrical engineering.

Though he's passionate about his academics, he's also been developing another love of his: music. He's an avid songwriter, vocalist, and emcee. Within a few short weeks, he became a core member of our Vanguard Development

Project — a collective of young artists who are passionate about pursuing careers in music.

"It's been a humbling experience to be accepted into this family. They've taught me to be my best self — not just with my music, but personally. They've helped me through some tough times."

For Amazia, music and engineering are two intertwining pieces of his heart. He plans to finish school, create a tech firm, and stay active as a musician.

"I've learned to see myself through the eyes of people who want me to succeed. I deserve good things if I have the passion, the drive, and make the time."

"No matter how hard your life is, there is always a chance to make it better."






